He was a Korean War era vet who served in the infantry. Born and raised in Braddock, PA, has resided in Ingram since 1968.

Preceded in death by his father, Bruno Scuglia of Vazzano, Catanzaro, Calabria, Italy; and his mother, Betty Cortese Scuglia of Naples, Italy and Braddock, PA; his sister, Rose Catherine Scuglia of Bridgeville; and his beloved wife of 42 years, Mercedes Cherry Scuglia.

He was a strong advocate for both unions and also persons with disabilities having served as chief officer for several organizations that were local, state-wide and national.
