



Charles Thomas Stover

October 20, 1941 - April 20, 2024

Charles "Chuck" Stover, 82, died on April 20, 2024. He was born on October 20, 1941, to John Clarence and Cora Earl (Isenberg) Stover. He is survived by his wife, Mary Elizabeth "Betsy" (Mozena) Stover, their daughter, Karen Pfeifer (Eric), their son, Rick (Joanie) and four grandchildren, Marisa and Matthew Stover, and Kyra and Bryan Pfeifer.

He lived his entire life in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and graduated from Oakmont High School, Slippery Rock State University (bachelor's degree), and the University of Pittsburgh (master's degree).

After his graduation from Slippery Rock, he began his career as a junior high school math teacher in Carnegie and then the Fox Chapel Area School District. He also spent many years teaching algebra to college students at the Community College of Allegheny County (Boyce campus) and finally at La Roche College long after his retirement from the public school system. His thousands of former students most likely remember him as a teacher who cared and told corny math jokes. It was only fitting that he passed on 4/20/2024 - a palindrome.

In the late 1960s, he took on supporting roles in Fox Chapel athletics, with his most enduring role as the videographer for high school events. He started with football and basketball and added many other sports until his retirement from that role just a few years ago. He was a fixture with Fox Chapel Athletics for 50 years and was recognized for his service by the Fox Chapel Area Schools Sports Hall of Fame in 2012. He had such a passion for sports and supporting the students who played them, which is why he continued to do it until his late 70s.

A Celebration of Life service will be held at 11 am on Saturday, May 25 at Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church, 1719 Mt Royal Blvd, Glenshaw, PA 15116. Light refreshments will be served following the service so the immediate family can receive family and friends.
