Fuh-Mei Lee Chiu, age 83, of O'Hara Township, passed away at home on October 21, 2023.

Fuh-Mei was born in Taipei, Taiwan on December 6, 1939, to the late Ying and Hsue Lee. Fuh-Mei moved to Pittsburgh in 1965 to marry her husband and raise a family. In 1979, Fuh-Mei received a Master of Science in health administration from the University of Pittsburgh Graduate School of Public Health. Fuh-Mei was passionate about flower arrangement and her other crafts. A lifelong adventurer, Fuh-Mei enjoyed traveling. She and her husband visited more than 50 countries over their seven decades together. Fuh-Mei was a member of the Taiwanese-American community and was active in the Pittsburgh Chapter of the Taiwanese Association of America.

A food enthusiast, Fuh-Mei was always excited when a new Chinese restaurant or bakery opened in Pittsburgh. She also loved ice cream and milkshakes!

Fuh-Mei is survived by her husband, Dr. Chao-Lin Chiu (Pittsburgh), and her son, Bruce Chiu and his partner Ashley McGrail (Pittsburgh). She is also survived by several siblings and family members in the U.S. and Taiwan.
