Harry was a World War II veteran, serving in the 646 Tank Destroyer Division during the Anzio Invasion and earned a Purple Heart at the Battle of the Bulge. He was a mail carrier for many years in the Bloomfield neighborhood of Pittsburgh and he had a special love for roller coasters, square dancing, family celebrations, and Pittsburgh, "Go Steelers!"

Harry knew that when he turned 90, he had "won the game of life." He will be forever remembered for humming while in his living room rocker or swinging on the front porch. He was a kind and gentle man, known as Hon, Dad, and Pappy, who will be missed more than our next breath.

Per his wishes, he has been cremated and requests no flowers be sent.
