"Aunt Teresa's and Uncle Jack's".

Aunt Teresa fostered a friendship between Amy and I. Amy and I would go to Bingo with Aunt Teresa's (YES!) at night. Ha HA. She taught us how to play and I even won a few times. Of course, Aunt Teresa always won BIG! HA HA. I had my first ever sleep over at Amy's.

I was always amazed at how Aunt Teresa could remember dates. She would rattle off my birth date and the three other nieces, nephews, cousins, brothers or sisters who were right before or after my birthday. At times, I didn't even know if all the dates she was saying were even correct. But, I just let her go with it, because she seemed to enjoy sharing her memories. I would just listen to her and enjoy seeing the subtle smile across her face.

She taught me "her" secret peanut butter Hershey kiss cookie that "she created". They were always my favorite. Still to this day, I make them for my kids and tell them the story of how Aunt Teresa would make these cookies when I was little "in the olden days" and they were always my favorite. I have even called Aunt Teresa many times while making them over the years and shared that they reminded me of her. I would check in and hear how she and her family and grandchildren were doing. She was always upbeat and thoughtful. The peanut butter Hershey kiss cookies are my daughters favorite too. I hope she will someday share my Aunt Teresa stories.

Aunt Teresa always made stuffed shells. As a child, I didn't know how she made those crazy shells...because at age 10 I thought she was magical and made everything from scratch. Who knows, maybe

she did, I never asked her. They were so delicious. Today, I buy stuffed shells for my own kids today and tell them how Aunt Teresa used to make these for me growing up.

Aunt Teresa was always kind. Always there. Always supportive. Never said harsh things about things I was too young to understand. To me, Aunt Teresa was an amazing supportive, loving Aunt who never took anything, instead she showed unconditional love and support.
